Tongyeong, South Korea, November 7, 2024 – HSG Sungdong has reached a major milestone, successfully completing its first load-out operation in collaboration with Ørsted, the renowned Danish energy giant. This accomplishment underscores the growing partnership between the two organizations and reflects their shared commitment to advancing the offshore wind power sector.

The load-out involved transporting Ørsted's suction bucket jacket to a site in Taiwan. By leveraging its state-of-the-art facilities and robust logistics capabilities, HSG Sungdong ensured that the entire process was carried out smoothly and within the designated time frame. The jackets will be installed in Taiwan Great Changhua 2b&4 offshore wind farm site and contributed to renewable energy industry for a very long time.



CONTRACT SIGNED FOR METHANOL SHIPS WITH SAMSUNG



PUSHING FORWARD WITH ECO-SHIP

HSG Sungdong has signed a contract with Samsung Heavy Industries for the half-ship construction of five fuelled 16,500 TEU container ships equipped with methanol fuelled main engine. The construction will set out in December 2024, with deliveries from December 2025 to February 2027.

This partnership strengthens HSG Sungdong's role in South Korea's eco-friendly shipping industry and its contribution to sustainable shipbuilding business. The agreement builds on mutual trust, as Samsung Heavy Industries has been sourcing half-ships from HSG Sungdong since 2022.

HSG Sungdong's experience in building high-value ships and offshore plant modules enhances its competitive edge in the eco-friendly ship market. With its diverse shipbuilding expertise and commitment to sustainable energy, HSG Sungdong is well-positioned to lead in methanol-fuelled ship construction, a key technology to meet Nox Tier-III, which is international rules regulation announced by IMO.
